

# Improvisational Theater Summer Clinics 2010

For current 5<sup>th</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup> Graders

Monday, July 19 – Friday, July 23, 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m., 24 students maximum

IMPROV I – **no experience necessary**

IMPROV IB – **for students who attended Improv 2009**

Cost: IMPROV I: \$250.00

Tuesday, July 27 – Friday, July 30, 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m., 12 students maximum

IMPROV II – **must take Improv I/ Improv 1B**

Cost: IMPROV II: \$200.00

*Each session will conclude with a performance on Friday. All students must wear comfortable clothing that is easy to move around in, wear close-toed shoes, bring a bag lunch and water bottle. Students participating in the full two-week intensive must bring a notebook and pencil as well.*

## IMPROV I:

A week long intensive clinic designed to instruct students in the core components of Improvisational Theatre. Each day will focus on one of the fundamental pillars of Improvisational Theatre: Environment and Location, Physicalization, and Character, Relationship, and Scene escalation. With our guest instructors, hailing from New York and as far as Australia, the students will learn the key components of what is involved in building truthful improvised scenes and stories.

## IMPROV 1B

Students who attended Improv Clinic in the summer of 2009 will learn what running/ producing an improv troupe/ show is all about: from planning your warm-up exercises to compering/ mc-ing/ and fronting scenes in shows in addition to the aspects of the basic curriculum of improv I. The program will include special workshops about the ins and outs of producing and compering an improv show. They will be responsible for the production of IMPROV I's final performance on Friday.

## IMPROV II:

After a long weekend to recuperate, IMPROV II students will return for a second week intensive series of master classes in which they will learn more specialized aspects of improvisational short form theatre and the theatre arts. Possible workshops include: masks, stage combat and stunt work, Rap, Improvised musicals, and the holy grail of improvisation: Long Form Improv. At the end of the week, the students will be expected to integrate what they have learned in their final performance.
